Plunder, Battles &amp; Spies</u></b> <i>Driving</i></p>	<p>Available in both English and Spanish, this tour traces both loyalist and patriot ground as it brings critical events of the Revolutionary War to life, from British warships firing on the Hudson to the treachery of Benedict Arnold.</p> <p><b>Key highlights:</b> Battles of White Plains and Pine's Bridge, Philipse Manor Hall, Captors Monument at Patriots Park, George Washington, Thomas Paine</p> <p><b>Sponsored by:</b> <i>Revolutionary Westchester 250, with funding from the County of Westchester and the Scarsdale Historical Society</i></p>

Canal Trail</b> <i>Walking/Cycling</i></p>	<p>Follow the historic Delaware &amp; Hudson Canal and learn the fascinating history of this vital waterway and the people who built it, while also enjoying the local flora and fauna that now thrive along its former banks.</p> <p><b>Key highlights:</b> The Canal Summit, Lock No. 50, Boothroyd House &amp; D&amp;H Canal Interpretive Center, P.
